Goals of The Israeli Geriatric Nursing Association:

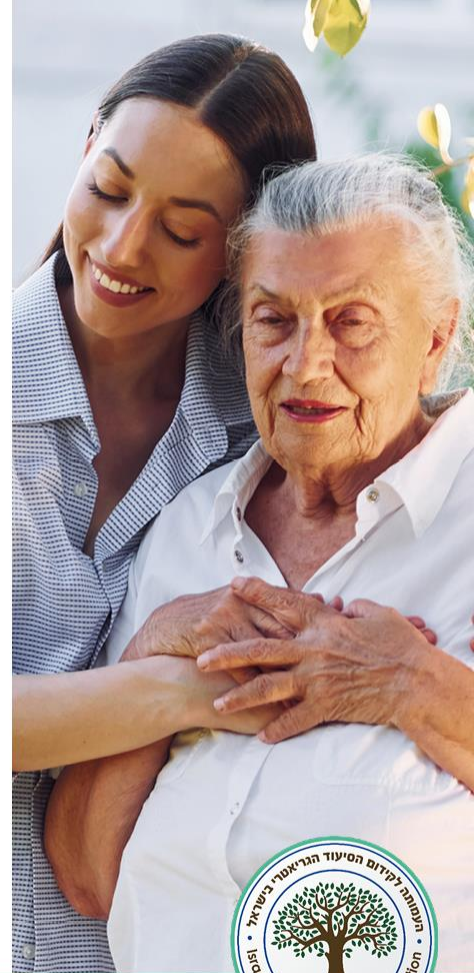
